At Pagosa Springs Elementary School (PSES) READ Act funds will be used to purchase a core reading instructional program, Open Court Reading Program published by McGraw-Hill. We have obtained a quote for over \$76,000 for grades k-2. District funds will be used to cover any resources not covered by READ Act funds.

At Pagosa Peak Open School READ funds will be used to hire a reading interventionist to provide services which are approved by the department

#### **Outcomes and Goals**

What are your LEP's expected outcomes and goals in the upcoming budget year from implementing your selected allowable activity(ies)?

Early identification of an SRD is important. Students who are identified in early grades (K-1) have a greater chance of reducing their risk for reading difficulties and no longer being identified as having an SRD by third grade as compared to those who are not identified until later grades. Early identification of an SRD is critical to supporting struggling readers. Students who are identified in early grades (K-1) have a greater chance of no longer being identified as having an SRD by third grade compared to those who are not identified until later grades. Understanding the need to identify, all students in grades k-3 will be screened within the first 3 weeks of school and appropriate monitoring using DIBELS and DIBELS deep will take place. PSES will continue Tier one strategies for all kids, but will also continue with a school-wide Tier two, focused on intervention and enrichment in reading.

Our anticipated goal is to keep identified SRD's at the same as lower level as 19-20. Our SRD numbers for 19-20 were: kindergarten = 2, first grade = 31, second grade = 20, third grade = 24.

What are potential barriers in reaching your expected outcomes and goals? How do you plan to address and/or overcome these barriers?

The largest potential barrier centers around the lost face to face instructional time in 19-20, and the anticipated uncertainty surrounding the 20-21 school year. The title teachers and grade level teams are working dilegently to address issues such as engagement in instructional activitites, family support, hard or paper copies of materials when needed, and social-emotional needs of our youngest learners.
