The summer school literacy program services only students enrolled in K-3 who have an SRD or students below grade level if space is available

The summer school literacy program will use scientifically based or evidence based instructional programming in reading that:

- Has been proven to accelerate student reading progress and;
- Provides explicit and systematic skill development in phonemic awareness, phonics, vocabulary development, reading fluency including oral skills, and reading comprehension and;
- Includes scientifically based and reliable assessments and;
- Provides initial and ongoing analysis of student progress in attaining reading competency

READ Act funds will be used to purchase a core reading instructional program that is included on the Advisory List of instructional programming in reading

READ Act funds will be used to purchase a supplemental instructional program that is included on the Advisory List of instructional programming in reading

READ Act funds will be used to purchase tutoring services focused on increasing students' foundational reading skills

The tutoring service is focused on increasing students' foundational reading skills of phonemic awareness, phonics, vocabulary development, reading fluency including oral skills, and reading comprehension for students who receive instructional services pursuant to READ plans

READ Act funds will be used to purchase from a BOCES the services of a reading specialist or reading interventionist who is trained in the science of reading and in teaching the foundational reading skills

READ Act funds will be used to provide other targeted, evidence-based or scientifically based intervention services to students who are receiving instructional services, which services are approved by the department

READ funds will be used to hire a reading interventionist to provide services which are approved by the department

Children identified as SRD and other students who are below grade level will be invited to join the four week program in June. The summer school programs, SuperKids and Learning A-Z, will use scientifically based or evidence based instructional programming in reading to accelerate student reading progress, provide explicit and systematic skill development, and monitor the students' growth with assessments.

The goal for summer school is to provide scientifically or evidence based reading instruction that maintains or increases the DIBELS scores of students with SRD.

Potential Barriers

Attendance of students is a potential barrier for reaching this goal for our students identified as SRD because if they don't attend any of our program or attend irregularly, they will not receive the needed instruction to maintain or increase their DIBELS scores. To address this barrier, parents will receive letters encouraging the attendance of their students, summer school will be engaging, and students will receive free breakfast and lunch through our summer food program.
