The first task in providing the tutoring service is to assess which students will benefit from the service. Information such as test scores, classroom performance, teacher observation and family input will be used to determine selected students. The program will target students or groups of students who are at greatest risk of having a significant reading deficiency. Specific time will be assigned for tutors to work with students on a regular basis.

Outcomes and Goals

The primary expected outcome of the program is to have all children read well, independently at their grade level. We also hope that students' self-esteem and confidence will increase through tutoring and that they will excel in school. Tutoring services will help students become better communicators and form positive relationships with their peers.

Potential Barriers

Finding qualified tutors is a potential barrier in the success of the program. Continued support will be provided by a reading specialist through ongoing training and supervision using methods such as workshops, group meeting, and modeling. Strategies for handling problem situations will be monitored by the program administrator with focus being on feedback and skill development.

Another barrier to the program will be providing consistent structure. Consistent structure helps both the student and the tutor to stay organized and focused on meeting individual goals.
