The district plans to implement summer literacy camp through Scholastic with students who are identified and qualify for services. The Scholastic resources are aligned with our Reading Street curriculum and SIPPS, which provides leveled reading support. In similar fashion, qualifying students will have access to tutoring services with teachers. The tutoring will consist of double dose time to work on basic reading skills and fundamentals. The district will utilize the funds to purchase allowable assessments to diagnose and progress monitor students as well. DIBELS is used as our diagnostic tool to progress monitor students. Teachers will be able to utilize funds for professional development to help provide intervention and differentiation for students.

#### **Outcomes and Goals**

Students are expected to achieve 1.5 years growth as measured by Dibels and STAR testing. Students will also show significant growth in state test scores.
