#### Implementing Allowable Activities

The district will use allocated time, salary and expertise of an experienced Reading Interventionist to strive and close any reading gaps that students may currently have between same aged peers in Kindergarten through third grade. The program the District currently uses for reading interventions is McGraw Hill Wonders. This Reading Interventionist will use best practices such as small group instruction and one on one instruction along with scientifically proven resources to help assess, create a plan and implement a plan that meet individual needs of students. The Reading Interventionist will communicate on a regular basis with general education teachers, ELL teachers, Special Education teachers and parents of students she works with daily. The Reading Interventionist will share what is working and train teachers and/or Paraprofessionals how to reinforce or implement practices that are working for each student in her small group settings in settings throughout the elementary building and in different content subject areas. The Reading Interventionist will adjust needs of students, resources used and grouping of students based on her continual progress monitoring and adjust as needed.

#### **Outcomes and Goals**

What are your LEP's expected outcomes and goals in the upcoming budget year from implementing your selected allowable activity(ies)?

The expected outcomes and goals would be to close any identified reading gaps between students on a Read Plan and same aged peers by the time they end third grade. A second goal would be for students that have worked with the Reading Interventionist would be able to apply the strategies and best practices they learned in their small group instruction or one on one instruction to maintain progress and not allow a gap to increase between peers even if the gap is not completely closed. A third goal would be to use all progress monitoring from one to three years to be shared with the special education department for those students that the achievement game increased or was not able to catch up with their peers. These records along with communications between the Reading Interventionist and the Special Education teacher will be able to pinpoint further needed testing and help create a more individualized education plan for the student.

#### **Potential Barriers**

What are potential barriers in reaching your expected outcomes and goals? How do you plan to address and/or overcome these barriers?

Several barriers include closing the gap for migrant students and students who qualify for ELL services as Non English Proficient students (NEP). It is very difficult to assess and create a Reading Plan for both migrant and NEP students. You first have to determine if the gap that is observable is due to a lack of instruction or lack of understanding and not understanding English.
