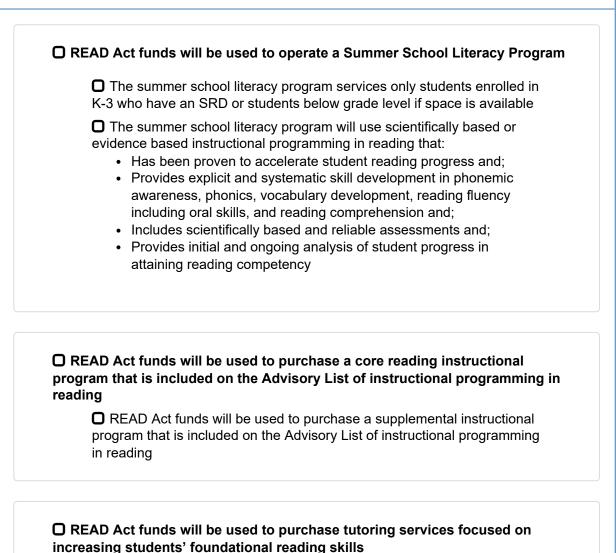

■ READ Act funds will be used to purchase from a BOCES the services of a reading specialist or reading interventionist who is trained in the science of reading and in teaching the foundational reading skills

We expect that a greater focus on the principals of the Science of Reading research and the tools that align with it will produce much greater success for our students in general education, intervention, and special education services. Strong application of the research based principals will provide support at all tiers of instruction, meet students needs more specifically, and decrease the amount of time students need to spend outside of general education.
