Mountain Valley School will use READ funds to support a full year of after school tutoring for the 2020-2021 school year. Two qualified elementary education licensed teachers will provide 32 weeks of instruction for 3 hours each week for a total of 96 additional hours of instruction to two groups of students who will be assessed through DIBELS as supported by Acadience Reading. Instruction will begin two weeks after the beginning of the 2020 school year and end two weeks before the end of the school year. Students in grades K-3 who fall below or well-below benchmark or progress monitor below benchmark will be supported in the after school tutoring program.

Each tutor will provide reading instruction to a group of up to four students or eight students total. This target number is based on Mountain Valley School READ data from the 2018-2019 school year in which MVS had six identified K-3 students with a significant reading deficiency and the 2017-2018 school year in which MVS had 9 identified students with a significant reading deficiency. Mountain Valley School's goal will be to reduce that number by 50% with the inclusion of addition tutoring services after school hours.

The tutors will be delivering the Lindamood-Bell Seeing Stars supplemental reading program by Gander Publishing as both have been trained in Seeing Stars during the last 4 years and have used the curriculum in their classrooms and for a summer school session during the 2018-2019 school year. The Seeing Stars program has recently been approved by the Colorado Department of Education and included on the advisory list as a supplemental reading program for K-3 phonics and word study.

Each tutor will receive \$1,575 at the end of the 2020-2021 school year. \$3150 + \$695 (benefits) = \$3845.00

96 hours of instruction will be provided, \$3,845/96 hours equates to approximately \$20 an hour for tutoring services.

**Outcomes and Goals** 

What are your LEP's expected outcomes and goals in the upcoming budget year from implementing your selected allowable activity(ies)?

Mountain Valley School seeks to provide foundational reading skills for all K-3 students and for each students to be at benchmark or above benchmark for the 2020-2021school year. Small group intensive tutoring outside of school hours will provide extra support for students with reading difficulties. Mountain Valley school will reduce the number of students with significant reading deficiencies by 50%.

#### **Potential Barriers**

- 1. Covid-19 school shut down could impede progress. We will continue with virtual instruction through Zoom or Google Meet.
- 2. Parental support and student participation. Using data and information about the READ act as a requirement for school districts, we will coordinate efforts with parents to participate fully to support their children.
- 3. After school transportation for students to get home may be a barrier. Mountain Valley will work in conjunction with our Americorps volunteers to provide transportation to student homes.
