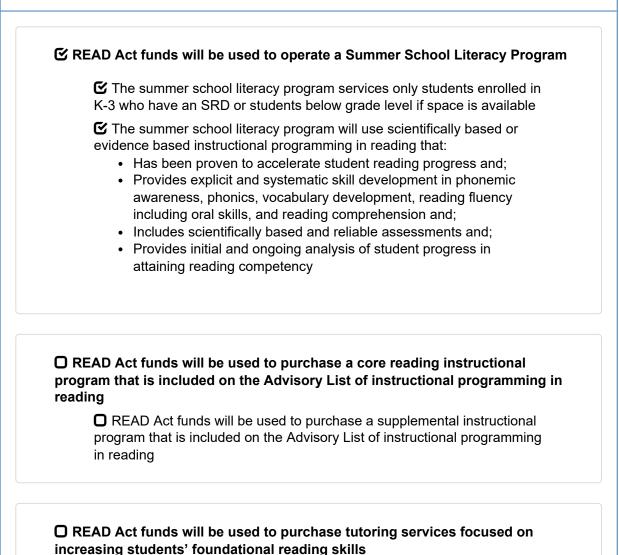

Implementing Allowable Activities

We plan to utilize our READ funds for for summer school provided by a highly qualified teacher to students identified as having an SRD in grades K-3rd. Students will be identified for this for summer school through our MTSS process. All students are given the DIBELS Next Assessment (Acadience) and then those falling below end of year benchmark targets will be offered the summer school literacy instruction. A state approved research-valided program will be utilized and this will take place 4 days per week, 90 minutes per day during the months of June, July and August. Right now, we plan to utilize Heggerty for support in Phonemic Awareness as well as the use of mClass reading for our Kindergartners and 1st graders. We are also exploring the use of A-Z Raz for fluency support for 1st, 2nd and 3rd grades.

#### **Outcomes and Goals**

80% or more of our students enrolled in our summer school literacy intervention program who scored well below end of year benchmarks on DIBELS Next (students in red) in May 2021, will either meet end of year benchmark targets or will at least move one level up to yellow in DIBELS Next.

80% or more our students scoring slightly below grade level (yellow) in May of 2021 will meet end of year benchmark expectations on DIBELS Next.

#### **Potential Barriers**

Two potential barriers to conducting an effective summer school literacy intervention program is 1) Parent approval and 2) Student Commitment and Attendance. We will plan to meet with parents at the time of the summer school referral to educate them on the benefits of maintaining quality literacy intervention and instruction throughout the summer. In regards attendance, school transportation can be provided should a child not be able to attend due to this potential barrier.
