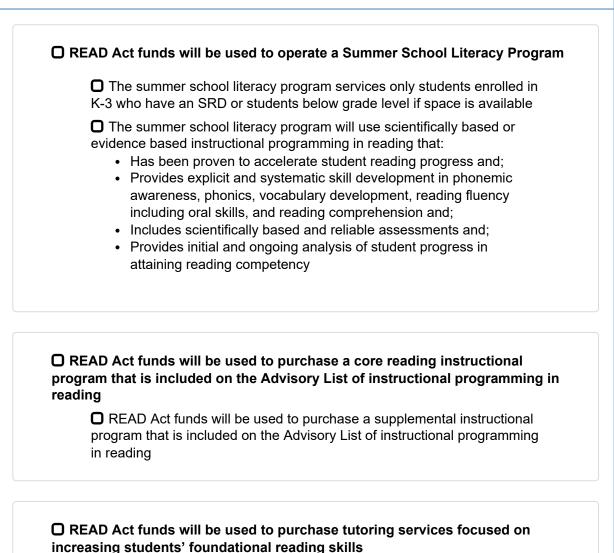

Implementing Allowable Activities

We currently use McGraw Hill's Reading Wonders as our core reading program and Really Great Reading's Blast and HD Word intervention programs, both of which are on the advisory lists. Funds will be used to purchase the necessary online licenses for teachers and students to access the resources to teach these programs. Funds will also be used to purchase print-based workbooks for these programs.

Lexia Core 5 is a valuable piece of our literacy instruction. READ Act funds will be used to purchase the annual license fee for this program.

As a staff, we have completed the first volume of LETRS, 3rd Edition. We will use READ Act funds to purchase licenses for all teachers of reading to complete the second volume during the 2020-2021 school year.

Outcomes and Goals

What are your LEP's expected outcomes and goals in the upcoming budget year from implementing your selected allowable activity(ies)?

We expect to continue to improve our reading instruction through the professional development we'll receive. We will implement the learning gained through the LETRS, Units 1-4 (focused on phonemic awareness, basic and advanced phonics) and build on that knowledge and understanding as we move into instruction around vocabulary, comprehension, and writing in LETRS, Units 5-8. Additionally, we expect to improve our students' overall reading abilities - increasing the number of students reading at or above benchmark and decreasing the number of students reading below benchmark.

Potential Barriers

What are potential barriers in reaching your expected outcomes and goals? How do you plan to address and/or overcome these barriers?

Time is always a potential barrier to reaching our goals. Completing LETRS professional development courses takes a considerable about of time - the online modules, the face-to-face trainings, and the in-class support. We will be as proactive as possible in creating time for this critical learning.

A second potential barrier is the myriad of possible alternative school structures because of COVID-19. Our systems are established to move kids in reading when they are in schools and classrooms with expert teachers. If students are learning from home or if they are in a hybrid model of school and online learning, we will need to adjust our delivery methods and structures so that students still receive the very best instruction and intervention.
