Implementing Allowable Activities

READ Act funds will be used to provide professional development programming to support educators in teaching reading. Professional development programming may include hiring a reading coach who is trained in teaching the foundational reading skills to provide job-embedded, ongoing professional development: Adams 12 plans to allocate money for the salaries of 12.5 reading interventionists to continue to take the LETRS course, units 5-8 (from the approved list of professional development programming) and subsequently apply their knowledge to provide scientific and research based reading intervention to students in kindergarten-third grade identified as having a Significant Reading Difficulty. Interventionists will participate in the LETRS training for Units 5-8 (Units 1-4 were approved for and completed during the 2020-2021 school year) and meet bi-monthly to discuss their learning and closely monitor student progress. Adams12 will continue to collaborate with the Voyager/Sopris West facilitators to determine the best design and structure to support the learning and application across both in person and remote learning environments. Adams 12 plans to pay the salary and benefits of one instructional specialist/reading coach and one dyslexia specialist/reading coach who will provide job-embedded professional development to educators in the implementation of the elements of evidence and scientifically based reading instruction (aligned to the required READ Act training). They are currently trained in Orton-Gillingham-Yoshimoto and have experience with several approved core and intervention programs (Fundations, Really Great Reading, Wonders). One coach will complete LETRS training and the other will continue to work on their dyslexia therapist certification. Both specialists will offer focused support to educators in understanding reading difficulties, like dyslexia, through beginning of the year required training and subsequent, on-going professional development and building-level support. They will partner with other staff across Learning Services to increase assessment literacy for K-3 educators and more closely align planning and instruction to specific student needs in reading. Adams 12 will also pay for PALS (from the approved assessment list) consumables for kindergarten. This is listed as "Other Services". Charter school allocations will be used to support the purchase of CDEapproved core, supplemental or intervention reading resources, listed as follows: Westgate: Superkids (grades K-2) and Wonders (grade 3); Really Great Reading (K-3) Prospect Ridge: CKLA Stargate: Orton-Gillingham-Yoshimoto
