2021/2022 Action Plan: For the 2021/2022 School year the Cherry Creek School District identified, purchased, and provided professional development for the approved core program, Into Reading. Professional learning took place spring 2022 for k-2, and implementation will begin fall of 2022. 3rd grade will begin professional learning in the 22/23 school year and implement 23/24. In light of the purchase of the approved core resource, Into Reading, we recognize we will need to add the following purchases to support the implementation. Decodable texts from Flyleaf (\$250,000) and Haggerty (\$250,000) for grades k-3. Into Reading Vocabulary Cards to support instruction in k-2 (\$37,951.63) READ funding was utilized to purchase digital resources: i-Ready Diagnostic Reading Assessments for k-3 as well as American Reading Company Foundational skills Toolkits.
