Littleton Public Schools will implement a K-3 READ Summer School program and purchase an approved third grade core reading program using the monies from the READ budget. 1. The K-3 READ Summer School is offered to LPS students exiting kindergarten, first grade, second grade, and third grade who have demonstrated a significant reading deficiency (SRD). This summer school program is designed to minimize the summer learning loss that can occur. It focuses on reinforcing and shoring up the literacy standards from the grade level the student has just exited so students are prepared to learn and to achieve at the standards for the grade level he/she will enter in the fall. Summer school is taught by teachers who have been trained in science-based literacy instruction. Instruction is supported by CDE approved curriculum and materials. The supplies for the Summer School will include Superkids consumables and materials that will be used daily by students participating in the K-3 READ Summer School. This includes ice cream paper and the summer Superkids materials for kindergarten. 2. Currently, Littleton Public Schools is not using a state approved third grade core reading program. During the 2021-2022 school year, the district will conduct a core reading program review that will only allow state approved core reading programs to be considered. By mid spring a state approved resource will be selected for implementation during the 2022-2023 school year. The selected resource will be used in all third grade classrooms in LPS. All of the materials and resources will be ordered and purchased before June 30, 2022. Littleton Academy and Littleton Preparatory Academy will purchase student materials for their core reading programs. 3. Currently, Littleton Public Schools does not have an identified literacy intervention program. During the 2021-2022 school year, the district's literacy specialists will collaboratively identify some state approved intervention instructional resources to purchase by June 30, 2022 and implement with Tier 2 instruction during the 2022-2023 school year.
