St. Vrain will use funds to provide professional development to effectively implement Heggerty, Fundations, Orton-Gillingham and Esperanza materials. St. Vrain will use funds to provide after/before school tutoring for students during the 2021-22 school year in alignment with their READ plans specifying a personalized focus on increasing students' foundational reading skills of phonemic awareness, phonics, vocabulary development, reading fluency including oral skills, and reading comprehension.
