Harrison School District 2 will use the READ funds at the school level in grades K-3 at each of the 14 elementary schools in the District. The use of the funds will be for targeted evidence based reading interventions, reading interventionists, technology, and reading coaches who will complete job embedded professional development to teachers of reading. The interventions will be provided to students who show that they have an SRD based on Accadience screener and confirmed by the DIBELS Deep diagnostic assessment. Interventions will be targeted to meet student's individual needs. In addition, some schools are purchasing reading interventionists to monitor and deliver the interventions to students. Some schools are purchasing technology, including software, that will be used to deliver the reading interventions and support core instruction and assessments. Reading coaches are present at all schools, some supported through READ funds, to provide professional development and support to our core reading teachers and reading interventionists
