Our Read Act funding will provide for two important program components to help accelerate student achievement and target the five core areas of literacy: a 4-week summer school program for elementary students in Grades K - 3, and work with a literacy consultant from CDE's approved list to provide ongoing professional development in Scientifically-Based Reading Research Practices. First, we will be working with Sterling Literacy Consultants to provide additional coaching and in-person training support to implement practices aligned to Scientifically-Based Reading Research. Qualifications of the literacy consultant include: on CDE's approved list of literacy consultant providers, and LETRS training. The literacy consultant was selected through an interview process. Consulting activities will focus on the five core components of early literacy, and customized professional development in accordance with Ellicott Elementary data and need analysis. The consultant has been trained in LETRS practices, and will support teachers in implementing these best practices at the same time teachers are completing the training independently. Consultant activities will include, but not be limited to: individual coaching, modeling lessons, observation/feedback, classroom walkthrough observations and debriefs, and leading school-wide professional development in SBRR. Secondly, The summer school program uses a research-based curriculum (Wonders 2020) to teach foundational reading skills to students at the Intensive and Strategic levels based on DIBELS end-of-year assessments. Students scoring at a strategic level are invited as space allows. Ellicott Elementary teachers use the core curriculum, as well as decodable and leveled readers, to teach phonics, phonemic awareness, and fluency skills. Students also receive instruction using Heggerty phonemic awareness curriculum, which has been approved by the state as a supplemental program.
