The programs we use include the following: Orton Gillingham: Yoshimoto Orton Gillingham Phonological & Phonemic Awareness, Phonics & Word Study, Vocabulary, and Text Reading Fluency, and SIPPS. The program we choose depends on the need of the student. 2.READ Act funds will be used to provide other targeted, evidence-based or scientifically based intervention services to students who are receiving instructional services, which services are approved by the department -READ funds will be used to hire a reading interventionist to provide services which are approved by the department We will supplement FTE's to help meet the need for a reading interventionist to provide targeted scientific-based intervention for students reading below grade level (SRD) using an approved intervention. The programs we use include the following: Orton Gillingham: Yoshimoto Orton Gillingham Phonological & Phonemic Awareness, Phonics & Word Study, Vocabulary, and Text Reading Fluency, and SIPPS. The program we choose depends on the need of the student. 3.READ Act funds will be used to provide professional development programming to support educators in teaching reading. We will provide LETRS Professional Development for 20 teachers to provide teachers scientific and evidence-based training in teaching reading.
