At the Bayfield Primary School, READ funds will pay for the partial FTE of three interventionists, one in grade K, 1, and 2, who will provide 30-minute intervention sessions for students with Significant Reading Deficiencies. Students will be served in small groups not larger than 5 depending on age and intensity of need. Interventionists provide sessions in addition to a student's universal reading instruction in the regular classroom. Orton-Gillingham and Really Great Reading materials will be used in grades K-2 At the Bayfield Intermediate School, READ funds will pay for the partial FTE of one interventionist in grade 3 who will provide 30-minute intervention sessions for students with Significant Reading Deficiencies. Groups of students in each session will not exceed 6. Orton-Gillingham and Lexia Core 5 Reading materials will be used in grade 3
