1. Wiggins Elementary School plans to utilize READ Act funds for the purchase of supplemental programming as approved by the Colorado Department of Education for instructional programming in reading. The specific program being purchased is LEXIA-Core 5 Reading. This program will be used in grades Kindergarten through 3rd grade for universal instruction and intervention. LEXIA differentiates the intervention for each student and the teacher then provides targeted instruction for specific skills - which instruction will occur in addition to the required 90 minutes of daily reading instruction. The LEXIA contract is an annual contract for unlimited use for the school year. 2. Wiggins Elementary plans to utilize READ Act funds to provide targeted instructional services provided by a reading interventionist specifically in grades Kindergarten through 3rd grade. Instruction is provided to students pursuant to READ plans. The reading interventionist will primarily work with small group on targeted skills within the regular classroom as determined by DIBELS and DIBLES Deep. The reading interventionist will also work with students who require one-on-one or pull-out instruction pursuant to READ plans. The interventionist will provide support during the regular 90-minute reading block for 1st grade as well as additional instruction and support during specific intervention times for grades kindergarten, first, second and third.
