In addition to the Lexia resource, the school district already has two other resources available for supplemental and intervention reading instruction: McGraw Hill - Wonder Works and Voyager Sopris Learning - Passport. These three resources will be used to provide extended-day services to students identified with a significant reading deficiency. The students will stay after school, one hour per day, Monday through Thursday, to receive the extra instruction. A combination of READ Act funds and Title I funding will be used to pay teachers to provide the extended day support for students with significant reading deficiency.
