Meeker Re-1 School District plans to use READ Act funds to build on its already existing comprehensive literacy program (well-prepared teachers and interventionist, adequate instructional time, scientifically based or evidence based instructional resources and intervention services, an assessment system to ensure consistency, and opportunities for parents and families to participate in their student's instruction) by implementing the following two allowable uses for the per pupil intervention moneys: To operate a summer school literacy program for SRD students and to partially fund the purchase of a new K-3 core reading instructional program, Wonders 2020, that is included on the Advisory List of instructional programming in reading.

Meeker Re-1 will use a portion of it's READ Act funds to support this initiative by replacing it's core instructional reading program (ReadyGEN) with a core program currently on the CDE approved advisory list (Wonders 2020). Grades K-3 will be adopting Wonders 2020 for the 2021-2022 school year. The total allocation to purchase Wonders 2020 for grades K-3 is \$73,629.
