Julesburg Elementary will plan to utilize our READ funds for summer school provided by a highly qualified teacher to students identified as having an SRD in grades K-3rd. Students will be identified through our MTSS process. All students are given the DIBELS Next Assessment (Acadience) and those falling below end of year benchmark targets for their grade level will be offered summer (literacy) school. A state-approved researched-validated program will be utilized and this will take place 4 days per week, 90 minutes per day during the months of June, July and August. Right now, we plan to utilize Heggerty for support in Phonemic Awareness as well as the use of mClass reading for our kindergartners and 1st graders. We will also incorporate the A-Z Ras for fluency support in 1st, 2nd and 3rd.
