All hired staff will be trained in Evidence-Based reading and participated in ongoing Professional Development around the support of struggling readers. For Charter Schools, READ fund will be used to: • operate a Summer School Literacy Program that services K-3 students identified with a Significant Reading Deficiency and uses scientifically- and evidence-based instructional • purchase a supplemental instructional program that is included on the Advisory List of instructional programming in reading. • provide other targeted, evidence-based or scientifically-based intervention services to students who are receiving instructional services which are approved by CDE • provide technology, including software, which is included on the Advisory List of instructional programming in reading • provide professional development programming to support educators in teaching reading.
