St. Vrain will operate a summer literacy program called Project Launch in June 2023 for students who are SRD and those below grade level reading in grades K-3 using evidence based reading strategies, explicit and direct instruction in alignment descriptions in section 22-7-1212 of the READ Act. Project Launch will use the Heggerty, Fundations and Orton-Gillingham programming. St. Vrain will use funds to purchase Heggerty, Fundations, Orton-Gillingham and Esperanza materials. St. Vrain will use funds to provide professional development to effectively implement Acadience, i-Ready Instruction, Heggerty, Fundations, Orton-Gillingham and Esperanza materials. St. Vrain will use funds to hire reading interventionists to provide direct services to for students during the 2022-23 school year in alignment with their READ plans specifying a personalized focus on increasing their foundational reading skills of phonemic awareness, phonics, vocabulary development, reading fluency including oral skills, and reading comprehension. Reading interventionists will use the Heggerty, Fundations and/or Orton-Gillingham programming depending on student needs and use Acadience measures for progress monitoring.
