Our district Significant Reading Deficient (SRD) population is typically at 30% at the beginning of the year. Through data analysis and review, we have determined that the use of a reading coach to train, guide and support classroom teachers, our SRD population decrease by at least 10% by the end of year data collection. Our district experiences significant summer mobility and consistently finds us at an approximately 30% Reading Deficient population at the beginning of the year again. We will use our READ Act funds to provide professional development programming to support educators in teaching reading by hiring a reading coach who is trained in scientifically and evidence based practices in reading.
