-Montrose Schools will implement summer school starting the beginning of June 2023. We identified students by using their DIBELS scores (K-3) that would be considered having a significant reading deficiency. Teachers will be utilizing researched based literacy interventions and program in order to meet the needs of students (DIBELS data, Orton Gillingham, Amplify Reading, CKLA and best practices). Students will attend four days a week for three weeks during the summer to address learning loss. -Montrose Schools will use part of our funds to purchase Benchmark Workshop student materials for students in K-3. -Montrose Schools is planning on using funds to partially fund two reading interventionists and to partially fund an Elementary Coordinator -Montrose Schools will be using a small portion of our funds to support our literacy interventionists and coaches with professional development in order to best meet the needs of our struggling K-3 students. This would include supplies for interventions (OG, SIPPS), trainings that support the science of reading, and/or professional development that supports closing the gap with our most neediest of students.
