The monies will be used to pay an interventionist to work with students in the at-risk categories on DIBELS. If possible, they will also work with students in the "some risk" category, however, the at-risk students will always receive priority. The interventionist will be providing one-to-one and small group instruction in the five essential components of reading, using the Read Well program and intervention pieces of Open court.. The intervention will be pull-out services and will occur during the first of two 40 minute scheduled interventions in the Master Schedule. The intervention instruction will occur in addition to the students' regularly scheduled 90 minute reading block within the classroom. Students that are eligible for the intervention will be determined through analysis of DIBELS and DIBELS DEEP scores/results. The intervention groups will be flexible based on need as determined by the progress monitoring that is conducted on a regular basis in collaboration with classroom teachers, interventionists, principals, and parents. The goal is to give students additional practice on skills within the five essential components of reading in a one to one and small group environment. Through targeting very specific skills based on each students' needs, and providing increase repetition on an increase individual level, the interventionist's services will increase students' overall fluency on key reading skills.
