3rd grade CKLA The district will use funds to purchase CKLA Core consumable and nonconsumable materials for approximately 700 third grade students. CKLA was piloted during the fall/winter of 21/22 and was adopted spring 2022. The program will be implemented in all elementary schools in the fall 2022. CKLA is on the approved READ Act advisory list for core materials. CKLA second grade knowledge building readers will be purchased for 635 second grade students. These materials will be used to supplement the core curriculum in the area of expository text. SuperKids The district will use funds to purchase SuperKids consumable and non-consumable materials for approximately 1800 kindergarten through second-grade students. SuperKids is on the READ act approved list for core materials. 95% Group Charter schools will use READ funds to purchase 95% Group Core Phonics kits and professional development materials for teachers. Kits include consumable workbooks, sound cards, poster sets, assessments, and manipulatives. SIPPS decodable book sets to be included in the classroom instructional library. Educational Impact The district will purchase six Educational Impact professional learning courses focused on vocabulary, assessment, accommodations, markers of dyslexia, and oral reading fluency. These courses will be available to all teachers and will be delivered in a hybrid format. Literacy coach The district will hire one literacy coach to provide job embedded, ongoing, focused, and data driven professional development, coaching, and mentoring to K-3 classroom teachers and specialists on the adopted core reading materials (K-2 SuperKids and grade 2 and 3 CKLA) as well as the district's approved foundational reading program.
