Additional funds will be used for purchasing supplemental programs (SIPPS & Really Great Reading Countdown, HD Word, Really Great Reading Blast) used by K-3 intervention and special educators. K-3 Core Reading program (HMH Into Reading) consumables will be purchased with the remaining READ Act budget funds to support our district growth. Windsor Charter Academy will use READ Act funds to supplement K-3 intervention teacher salaries. Interventionists provide instruction to students on a READ plan using research-based interventions from CDE's approved supplemental and interventions program list daily during the 45 minute WIN (What I Need) block.
