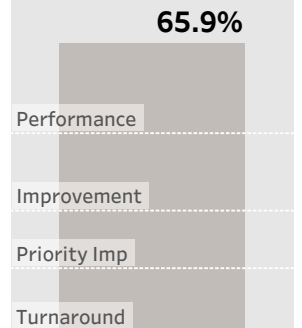

**Matriculation Rates:** reflect all 2017 high school graduates that enroll in a Career & Technical Education (CTE) program or a 2-Year or 4-Year Higher Education Institution (both in-state and out-of-state enrollments) during the subsequent academic year. Also includes graduates that earned a CTE certificate from an area technical college or a college degree while still enrolled in high school.
